National Humanities Center Professional Development Seminars

**High Quality, Low Cost Professional
Development Credit for California Teachers**



A partnership between the National Humanities Center (NHC) and Regional & Continuing Education at CSU, Chico provides California K-12 teachers the opportunity to earn university credits for completing online professional development seminars from the NHC.

Seminars are taught by leading scholars from across the nation and offer concentrated study of specific historical topics. Seminars are live, online, and enable teachers to interact with each other as well as with the faculty scholar.

Through an existing collaboration with the California Department of Education, NHC seminars are free for California K-12 teachers. This represents a \$35 tuition savings for each seminar. Upon completion of five seminars, teachers can apply to CSU, Chico for one hour of University credit for a nominal \$60 per unit fee. The total cost of only \$60 per credit hour represents a 75% savings on a series that would otherwise cost teachers \$235.
