ONLINE DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAM AT CHICO STATE

Humanities is a program devoted to the study, appreciation, and analysis of cultural traditions from an interdisciplinary perspective. It focuses on the arts (including literature, music, theatre, sculpture, painting, architecture, film) and ideas (philosophical trends, artistic movements, and religious traditions) by examining individual works and thinkers in their particular cultural and historical contexts.

CHICO STATE'S BACHELOR OF ARTS IN HUMANITIES

This fully-online degree allows students to become a well-rounded, educated problem solver, a fluent writer, and a person who can examine issues from many perspectives. It prepares students for careers requiring adaptability that comes from a broad cultural and intellectual background. Students work closely with outstanding professors in small classes that will both challenge and closely support their learning.
