## **DIRECTOR'S REPORT 2018-2019**

#### LAST YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS

### **2018-19 FINANCIAL OVERVIEW**

The long-term sustainability of OLLI was a central focus this year. The implementation of the Five-Year Strategic Plan, a 30th Anniversary fundraising campaign, and first-time legacy gift commitments highlighted a shift from day-to-day operations to a broader, more comprehensive commitment to the program's long-term future. Additionally, the OLLI Reserve Fund is growing, with more than half of this year's fundraising campaign dollars going directly to OLLI's "rainy day" fund. While donations and volunteerism are at an all-time high, OLLI experienced a drop in overall memberships for the second year in a row, largely attributed to fee increases both years. An additional focus on outreach and recruitment was expanded to help close the gap and a payment plan option was introduced in November, from which OLLI hopes to see more benefit this fall. Thanks to a record level of giving in 2018-19, fees remained flat for the 2019-20 academic year, which should also help stem a further decline in overall membership. Thank you donors! #### **OLLI COMMUNITY UNITES WHEN IT MATTERS MOST**

On November 8, 2018, the Camp Fire roared through the lives of too many of our members and their extended families and left us all reeling in its aftermath. OLLI staff and volunteers jumped into the void, quickly tracking all 87 members who were directly impacted. With the help of a gift from Mr. Osher, OLLI launched the Wishing Wreath program, whereby members who'd been displaced could request gifts, and members eager to help could respond by fulfilling these wishes with gift cards affixed to a tree. The program helped bring OLLI members together and provided encouragement when needed most.

#### **SOCIAL CONNECTIONS BUILD OLLI COMMUNITY**



#### **OLLI "ANNEX" PROVIDES MEMBER SERVICES ON SITE**

The Social Chico supports intergenerational "campus" concept.

Having a remote campus presents challenges when the primary office is located more than a mile away. To help bridge this gap, OLLI opened a new service counter outside its largest classroom, Bradley 2, at The Social Chico complex, formerly known as Craig Student Living.

Staffed on a rotating basis by office employees and volunteers, the "OLLI Annex" provides face-to-face member services and quick solutions to frequently asked questions. Feedback has been overwhelmingly positive and our increased presence there has fostered additional outreach, like the bright red book cart donated by OLLI member and peer leader Maureen Fredrickson. Located in front of the OLLI Annex, the cart encourages members to drop off a book they've enjoyed and pick up another. Browsing the cart has proved a good conversation starter!

However, keeping the OLLI Annex staffed on a regular basis is more difficult than anticipated, and we're hopeful to increase our presence there in 2019-20 with your help. Responsibilities include meeting and greeting members, answering basic questions, and directing messages to the home office – all for which we would happily provide some basic training.

Four original plays featured more than 30 creative people—writers, directors, actors, and stage hands—all OLLI members, many of whom are new to theater. The Blue Room Theater downtown was host for the fourth time, providing some of their experienced staff to assist in bringing the productions to life. #### ADVISORY COUNCIL LEADERSHIP OPENING NEW DOORS

A newly restructured Advisory Council format was productive, with five new members serving alongside eight continuing members. Monthly meetings operate as workshops, where AC members work in groups to advance individual projects. This hands-on engagement, in addition to regular financial reports and policy-making, has proven to be both productive and gratifying, with volunteer leaders taking ownership of some of OLLI's most important initiatives.

One of the strategic priorities of the 2018-19 Advisory Council was to create more innovate classes and activities. Thirteen new classes were added to the schedule, including the **CSU**, **Chico Faculty Lecture Series** that launched in spring. A **Lunch Around Town** class, tested this summer, emphasized ways to bring members together socially. These classes really struck a chord with members, who are looking for new ways to connect with campus and with each other.

The Advisory Council is also **expanding OLLI travel opportunities—locally and abroad!** Following the lead of several other Osher programs in the 123-member network, OLLI Chico is partnering with Overseas Adventure Travel (O.A.T.) and Grand Circle Cruise Line to enrich the "field trip" portion of the OLLI curriculum.
