

International Nurse REMEDIATION PROGRAM

AT CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, CHICO

The **International Nurse Remediation Program** provides concurrent theory and clinical courses for nurses who have been educated outside of the United States and who must remediate deficiencies in their education as determined by the State of California Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) in order to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) and receive their nursing license.

Summer 2020 Obstetrics Program

All program courses have been approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) and, when taken concurrently, satisfy the BRN’s maternal requirements for internationally-trained nurses to take the state licensing exam.

NURS 317: Maternal Nursing Theory Course ~ Online

The course presents the theoretical basis for the evidence-based practice of maternal nursing, including knowledge basic to the professional nursing care of the antepartum, intrapartum, and postpartum mothers, newborns, and their families.

NURS 318: Maternal Nursing Practicum ~ On-site Clinical Course 2–3 days per week for 3 weeks

This is a directed and supervised practicum course, focusing on maternal nursing and care of normal and high-risk childbearing families. Experiences are provided in skills lab, simulation center, and hospital settings to provide students with the opportunity to apply knowledge and the nursing process to the health of pregnant women, and newborns.

- Internationally-trained nurses who need to remediate BRN deficiencies in order to take the state licensing examination (NCLEX)
