# Financial Aid Information for Special Session Master's Degree Programs (MS in Agricultural Education & MS in Math Education)

## **General Financial Aid Guidelines**

CSU, Chico students who meet <u>basic eligibility requirements</u> and are enrolled in RCE Special Session Master's degree programs may be eligible for federal *Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, Alternative (or Private) Educational Loans, and scholarships only.* Information about federal loan programs and Alternative Educational loans are available on the CSU Financial Aid and scholarship webpage under <u>Types of Aid</u>. *Please Note:* RCE Special Session Master's degree programs *are <u>not eligible</u>* for State financial aid programs (Cal Grant, Middle Class Scholarship, State University Grant) and fee waivers (including Cal-Vet fee waivers and employee fee waivers).

Master's students are required to be enrolled at least half-time (4 units for students pursing a Master's degree program) in order to be eligible for loans. Additionally, students are required to maintain <u>satisfactory academic progress</u>.

#### How to Apply

Students may apply for financial aid by filing the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u>. You must complete a new or renewal FAFSA for each academic year you wish to be funded. When completing the FAFSA, include CSU, Chico as a college you want your FAFSA information sent to. CSU, Chico's Federal School Code is 001146.

If you are eligible for alternative/private education loans only, you do not need to file a FAFSA. These loans are borrowed directly from a lending institution. Please see <u>Alternative/Private Education Loans</u> for more information.

#### **Disbursement Information**

Once you are admitted into your program, your financial aid can be processed. An email will be sent to your Wildcat email account, notifying you of your financial aid offer. You will need to access your Student Center through the portal to accept, reduce, or decline your financial aid offer. You will also need to check your Student Services Center to determine if there is anything on your "To Do List" that you must complete. Funds will not disburse until your "To do List" is complete.

Fee payment may be deferred if you have accepted your financial aid offer for the semester you are enrolled. However, funds will not disburse until your "To Do List" is complete and all other holds cleared. When financial aid funds are disbursed, fees are deducted from your award, and any remaining amount will either be directly deposited to your checking account (EFT) or sent to your mailing address. Make sure your mailing address is updated on your Student Services Center.

The faster and preferred method for receiving your aid is via Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT). If you have not signed up for EFT, a check will be sent to your mailing address.
